
Be it further resolved that this Resolution supersedes Resolution No. 2017-059.



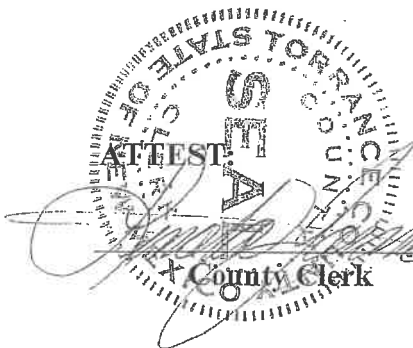
James "Jim" Frost, District 1
